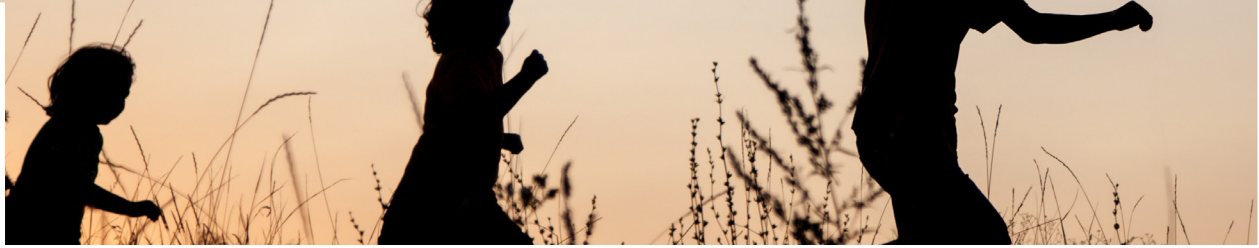

Key Accomplishments

- Launched 2 new prevention programs, Saving Our Sisters (S.O.S.) and CDF Freedom Schools.
- On average, 38 clients resided in our inpatient program throughout the year.
- Supported 778 clients through Behavioral Health Intervention Services with 20,694 hours of service.

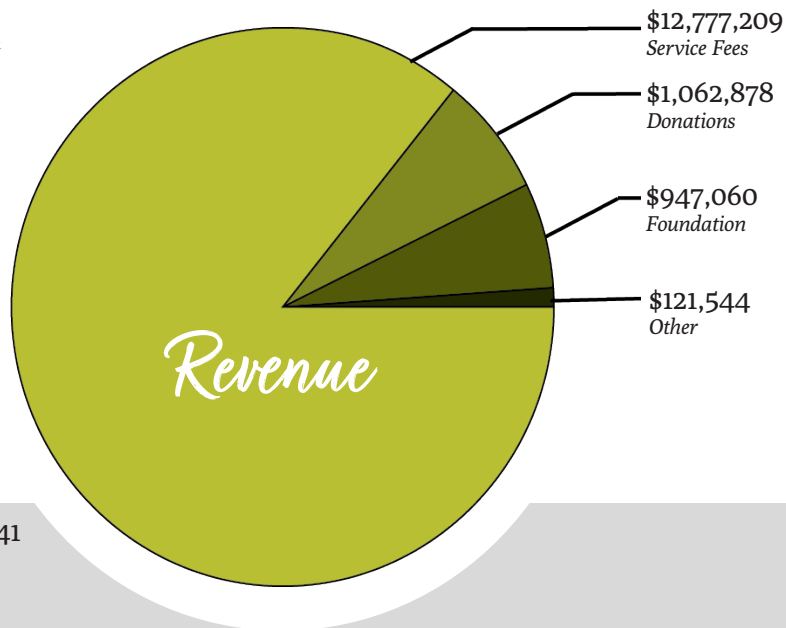
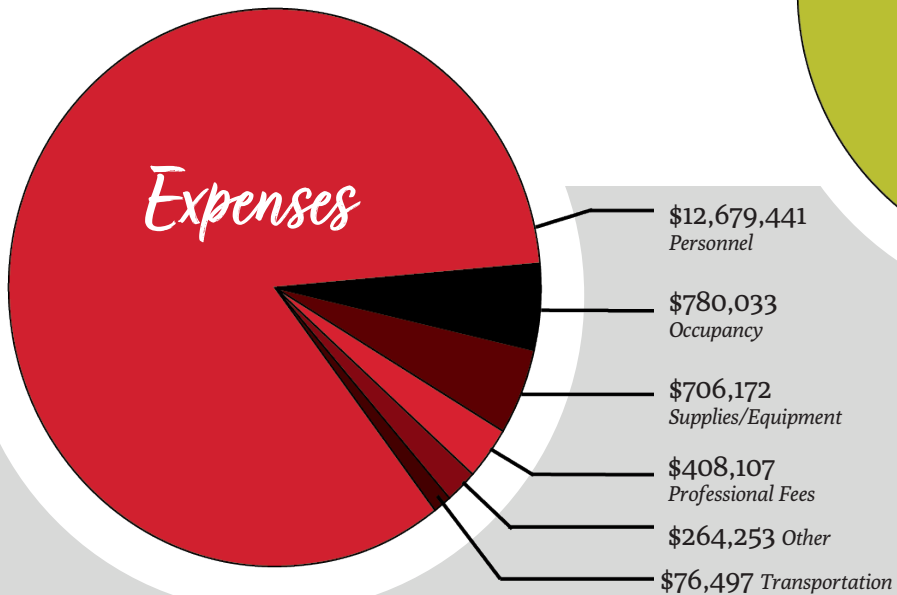

Program Highlights

TANAGER PLACE LGBTQ YOUTH CENTER

The LGBTQ Youth Center provides a safe and confidential place for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and questioning youth and allies to connect, learn and grow. Launched in 2018, the Center aims to give LGBTQ youth and families a supportive space where they can be uniquely themselves. Through advocacy, support, education, and celebration, youth strengthen their sense of identity and increase their involvement in the community.

The Center hosts programs and events, open hours, and a bi-monthly meal program. Additionally each year, a prom, pride month and luncheon are celebrated.

In a recent year-end survey of Center participants, 96% of program participants agreed or strongly agreed the Center has improved feelings of social acceptance. 84% of program participants agree or strongly agree that the Center has improved their social skills and confidence.

This summer Camp Tanager served 391 day campers and 341 overnight campers who were able to attend camp at no charge because of our scholarship program. 42 campers attended our medical camp designed to meet the needs of those with diabetes. Campers were welcomed and acclimated with a new look and feel while the renovations at Camp Tanager were being wrapped up.

Tanager Place received a \$1.8 million dollar gift in 2019 from Jared and Carol Hills. Their gift increases camper capacity through expansion, and the construction project broke ground in the fall of 2020. When you visit Camp Tanager, you are greeted by a new driveway, an impressive grand lodge, a 24-bed sleeping cabin and a new parking lot.

Although this year's camp season and sessions were modified to minimize the risk of Covid-19, campers still had a fun-filled season, which included camp fires, cook outs, swimming, archery, and more, making for great memories.

New Prevention Programs

SAVING OUR SISTERS (S.O.S.)

Tanager Place and the African American Family Resource and Planning Committee partnered together to create a program called S.O.S., Saving Our Sisters. Goals of the program were identified as community building, establishing mentors and friendships, and creating a safe environment. The program facilitators led discussions about how program participants could become future leaders in the communities in which they choose to live and work. S.O.S. was funded through the Greater Cedar Rapids Community Foundation's Creating Safe, Equitable and Thriving Communities (SET) Fund. Tanager Place was one of five nonprofits selected to receive funding through the SET fund.

Mission Moment

"We build community every day in every way. When a S.O.S. participant's mom was in the hospital, we supplied her family with food through donations. The participant's mom reached out to say how much she appreciated the effort because it took such a load off her and her family. In this moment we mentored by example, and took care of others and created a safe space and place to experience love and understanding.

Another example comes from one of our regulars who participated in an activity that was all about colors and emotions. Weeks after that session, she returned for group and said, "I wore pink because I want to have a joyful spirit." Raising awareness of self and creating a safe place for kids to freely express their emotions is so valuable in helping them to have the strength to be true to themselves. CDF FREEDOM SCHOOLS

Summer 2021 brought the first-ever Children Defense Fund Freedom Schools program to Iowa, hosted by Tanager Place. Thirty 6th-8th graders from the Cedar Rapids Community School District attended the free program, which was held Monday through Friday for six weeks this summer.

Participants received breakfast, lunch, and a snack each day and took home a new book each week to add to their personal library. Throughout the summer, program participants enjoyed field trips and engaged in hands-on learning and reading activities. Freedom Schools was led by young adult teachers and mentors known as Servant Leader Interns. These individuals came from diverse backgrounds and helped the students envision themselves as future college students, advocates, and leaders.

Of the 30 participants in Freedom Schools, 20 completed pre- and post-tests and demonstrated an average increase of one year and five months in instructional reading levels.

Attendance was high, the culture felt safe and collaborative, and kids seemed to be genuinely having fun and learning. There were a few students from McKinley who I have worked with previously and they both shared they were really enjoying the program.

Bridge to the Future Scholarships

Tanager Place was pleased to award over \$55,000 in scholarships through the Bridge to the Future program in the spring of 2021. Scholarships were awarded to young people who engaged in Tanager Place programs for a minimum of six months of service in the recent two years and demonstrated a desire to move on to post-secondary education.

Scholarships were awarded to seven students who attend Coe College, Kirkwood Community College, Cornell College, and the University of Iowa. The scholarship program was made possible by an anonymous donor, who generously created an endowment for the program with a one million dollar offering.

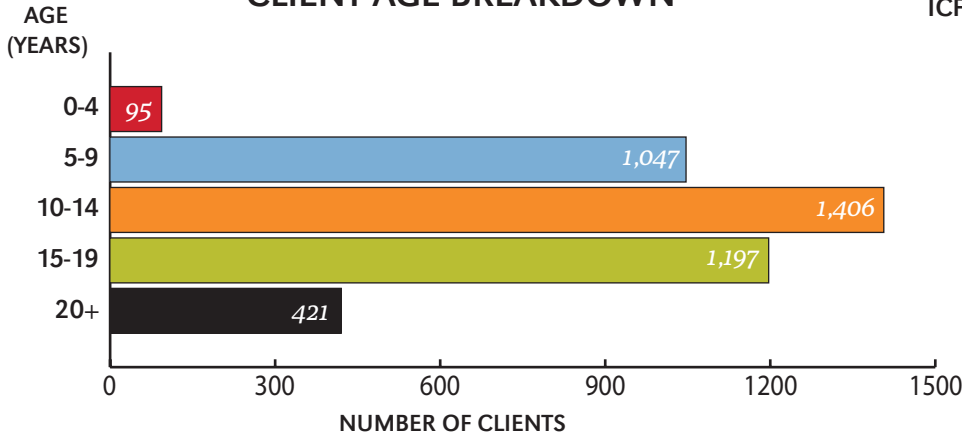

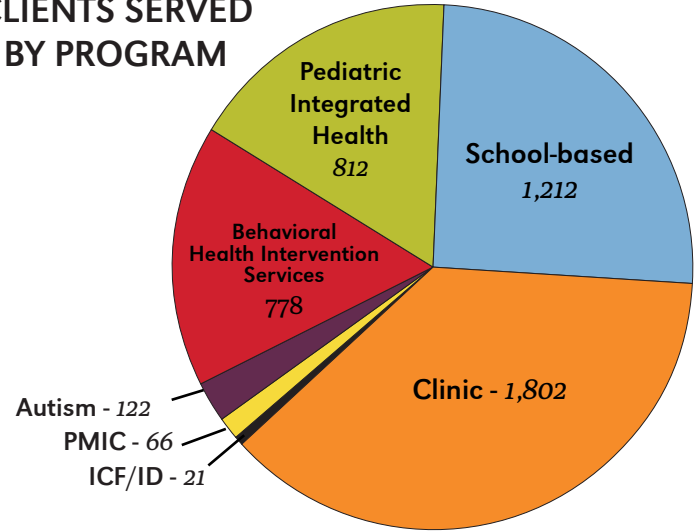
